Map Practice – Use your map of Europe and North Africa

1. Label GERMANY and ITALY, the leading Axis Powers in Europe. Print the names in CAPITAL LETTERS. Lightly shade these countries with a colored pencil, marker, or pen.
2. Label the following countries that were under Axis control by the summer of 1941. Print their names legibly.

Poland	Hungary	Lithuania	Tunisia

Lightly shade these countries with the same colored pencils, markers, or pens you used on Germany and Italy.

3. Print Adolf Hitler inside of Germany, and Benito Mussolini next to Italy.
4. Draw an arrow from Germany to Poland. Next to it print 1939 – WWII begins.
5. Label the two major Allied Powers in Europe that the Germans failed to capture – GREAT BRITAIN and RUSSIA. Use CAPITAL LETTERS. Lightly shade them with a different color than the one used on the Axis powers.
6. Label the countries that remained Neutral:

Portugal Spain Switzerland Sweden Ireland

Print the word Neutral in parentheses below the name of each of these countries. Again, shade them with a different color than the previous two colors.
